







## **TUTORIAL 12**

### Use PAMS for LOI Submission

If you're just starting a business and have never submitted a proposal to the federal government, you will be surprised by the number of registrations that

must be completed before you can submit your Phase I SBIR/STTR application to a federal agency. When submitting a proposal to the Department of Energy, the first system with which you should register is the **Portfolio Analysis and Management System**, also known as

PAMS. This is the Department of Energy's web-based system for managing proposals submitted in response to its funding opportunity announcements.

#### PAMS REQUIRED FOR LOI SUBMISSION

In order to submit an SBIR/STTR Phase I proposal application to the Department of Energy, you must first


submit a Letter of Intent (LOI). In order to do this, you must have previously registered with PAMS –as this is the vehicle through which the LOI must be submitted. This is not a difficult registration. The whole process should take no more than 10 minutes. Although PAMS will ask for a

DUNS number and an employer identification number (EIN), these are not necessary in order to register with PAMS.

Be sure to submit your Letter of Intent (LOI) on time for the DOE SBIR/STTR programs through PAMS

#### **A TWO-STEP PROCESS**

PAMS registration is a two-step process: First create an individual account for yourself. Then, affiliate this account to your institution. If you have any questions don't hesitate to contact the help desk by email of phone Monday through Friday from 9:00 AM – 5:30 PM Eastern Time. Screen shots are also available which provide a step-by-step overview of the registration process on the PAMS Help page.

As the PAMS site is used by applicants to other DOE funding opportunities as well as reviewers, when going to the PAMS help page, only concern yourself with materials through submitting a Letter of Intent, as you will use PAMS exclusively for this purpose.
